CARING FOR OUR STUDENTS AND ROAD SAFETY

Children are our most vulnerable road users because of their unpredictability which can expose them to risk when around traffic. Our children need adult help in the road environment and regular opportunities to develop and practise skills together with adults. Children learn road safety habits by watching and copying others, so it is important that parents and caregivers set a good example when picking up and dropping off their children to school.

The school is currently working with our Road Safety Officer from Bankstown-Canterbury Council. We encourage all parents to talk with their children about roads, signs, traffic, and how and where we cross the road to ensure that every child is always safe.

Below are some posters provided by our Road Safety Officer, which cover driving offences in school zones. We need to work together to make our roads safe for every user in particular for our children.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Al Noori Muslim School continues to be safe, and operations are in line with Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health advice. All students should be attending school unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence.

All school activities permitted at school will be conducted in a way that is safe and appropriate in the current environment. Activities that remain on hold will be reviewed at regular intervals and will recommence when appropriate, based on health and other relevant advice.

All parents are required to abide by all social distancing precautions while in and around our school. Parents are reminded to **maintain a 1.5 metre distance** from all other adults. Parents who enter the school grounds for reasons such as school events, parent meetings or to attend the sick bay, will need to sign in at the front office and use the **QR code to check in and out**.

NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM -LITERACY AND NUMERACY (NAPLAN)

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It is a nationwide measure to determine if young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for their learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

The NAPLAN assessments will take place between Tuesday the 11th of May and Friday the 21st of May 2021. Al Noori Muslim School students will be completing NAPLAN online, except for Year 3 Writing. The Year 3 Writing test will be conducted on paper.

Students in NAPLAN grades 3, 5, 7 & 9 are expected to use both their knowledge and ICT skills to complete the assessments.

Parents are encouraged to visit the NAPLAN public demonstration site to familiarise themselves and their children with the student test experience and functionality. Parents may access the public demonstration site at the following link:

YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH & WELLBEING

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school, will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law. These classes begin at 9:00am and conclude at 12:15pm. *Parents are reminded that students must be picked up on time.* The next three classes will be on:






